Music for Weddings

Congratulations! I'm excited to have this opportunity to work with you for this liturgical celebration. I hope these resources assist you in planning a wedding that truly celebrates God's great gift of love in your lives. As Director of Music for St. Anne, I will serve as your pianist/organist. My assistant and vocal professional, Lisa Pecarina, will serve as the cantor. In the event I am unable to play, Lisa or another professional organist/pianist will take on that role. The same applies to me finding a cantor in Lisa's absence.

I can meet with you in person, use virtual apps (Zoom or Facetime), phone, and/or email to discuss options and the flow of the ceremony. Our meeting should take place at least 2 months before your wedding. Selections should be finalized 1-2 weeks following the meeting.

The use of pre-recorded music (compact discs, tapes, digital) is not permitted. Secular music, such as popular love songs, music from stage productions and movies, and current popular songs, (vocal or instrumental) will not be a part of the church ceremony. The popularized wedding marches of Wagner ("Here Comes the Bride") and Mendelssohn should not be used as they come from operas in which the marriage ceremony is a farce. Just because a song uses "God" in the lyrics, does not make it appropriate for the liturgy.

Music Fees

Wedding Outside of Mass - Accompanist fee - \$125 - Cantor fee - \$75

Wedding Mass - Accompanist fee - \$150 - Cantor fee - \$100

Checks are to be made out to Jermaine L. Evans (accompanist) and Lisa Pecarina (cantor) at least one month in advance of the wedding date.

Extra musicians can be arranged if you are interested. Their fees and agreement are separate from mine. Although I will help to coordinate the music, I am not responsible for their payment. You will make checks payable to them and I will deliver them. Musical selections must be liturgically appropriate.

<u>Attendance at Rehearsal</u> - I will be present at the rehearsal to make final notes and give you an idea of what will take place on the actual wedding day. The cantor (or extra hired musicians such as trumpet, violin, etc.) will not be present.
